### Principal's Report





We are concerned about the amount of time students miss learning at school when they arrive late to school and take long holidays during term times.

#### **Every day counts**

Going to school every day is the single most important part of your child's education. Students learn new things at school every day – missing school puts them behind.

#### School is better when your child is there

We all want our students to have a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day when they are well.

Please, of course, do not send your child to school when they are unwell.

If students are away from school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school.

#### Student absences

The main reasons for absence are:

**Sickness** – There are always times when students need to miss school, such as when they're ill. It's vital that they're only away on the days they are genuinely sick, and developing good sleep patterns, eating well and exercising regularly can make a big difference.

**Family holidays** – It's vital that trips are planned during school holidays where possible, and not during the term. If you are planning to go on holiday during term time, make sure that you talk to your child's school in advance, and work with them to develop an absence learning plan.

"Day off" – Think twice before letting your child have a "day off" as they could fall behind their classmates – every day counts.

**Truancy** – This is when students choose not to go to school without their parent's/carer's permission. There can be many reasons for truancy. The best way to address this is for schools and parents/carers to work together.

**School refusal** – School-refusing children will experience significant emotional distress not only when going to school but also at the thought of going to school; they may be absent from school for weeks or even months at a time. School refusal differs from truancy as children generally stay home with their parent's/carer's knowledge, despite their best efforts to encourage their child to attend school.

# Being away from school for one day a fortnight equals missing 1.5 years over 13 years of school.

If you're having attendance issues with your child, please let your classroom teacher know so we can work together to get your child to school every day.

#### **YEAR 2 SCIENCE**

This term, the Year 2 students have been learning about the topic of forces during their science lessons with Mrs. Gilligan. Students have enjoyed learning about push and pull forces and conducting scientific investigations. They explored how gravity works by rolling and dropping objects that were different sizes and shapes, investigating what happens and how quickly they reach the ground. Students also experimented with friction by pulling different objects along rough and smooth surfaces, and even got to make helicopters! Thank you, Mrs. Gilligan, for making science so fun!











#### YEAR 4 HISTORY BOX IN-SCHOOL VISIT

On Wednesday the 9th of October, Year 4 students enjoyed a 90-minute History Box in-school visit. This activity was a very educational (and fun!) start to Term 4. Presenters Barry and Cynda began their visit by helping students to gain a better understanding of the arrival of the First Fleet. Through some role-play, the Year 4s learned about a number of significant British, and also First Nations, figures of the early settlement period of Australian history.

At the completion of the engaging introduction in the school hall, students returned to the Year 4 classrooms to rotate, in groups, through four different hands-on activities. These were: quill and ink handwriting, spice grinding, clay 'love token' coin making and Ngaka Ngaka game play. Ngaka Ngaka is an Aboriginal game played in a similar fashion to Tic-Tac-Toe. 'Ngaka Ngaka' means 'Look Look'. Thanks, History Box, for a memorable in-school visit!

Come and join in the fun of learning to play keyboard, guitar, here at Glendal Primary School.


Creative Music for Schools conducts a music program here at school each week.


