# Principal's Report

Paul has initiated and led improvements across our school grounds and to our school facilities, played a leading role in our Year 6 student leader development program, and contributed to our positive and supportive school culture. Paul has deputised for me as Acting Principal on many occasions very professionally. He will be missed and we are all very appreciative of his work over the past eight years at Glendal.

I am pleased to announce the appointment of Mr Joshua Crozier to our school as Assistant Principal replacing Paul from later January 2025. Josh is currently the Assistant Principal at Highvale PS. He has significant experience as an Assistant Principal and Acting Principal in smaller schools and we welcome him to Glendal. He will be checking in with our school next term, working with Paul to ensure a smooth handover for 2025 and importantly, familiarising himself with our school operations, culture and meeting our staff.
